

"As the gap between conditions that cry out for socialist transformation and the long-diminishing political capacities of the Western left grows ever more dangerous, Garrido's brilliantly pithy and well-thought philosophical book argues that a good part of this gap is accounted for by the Western and US left's 'purity fetish.'

This fetish, Garrido argues, drawing from Hegel, Marx, Parenti and Losurdo, arises from an inability to think dialectically, an inability to realize that the abstract has no existence other than in necessarily compromised concrete instances that are always and everywhere 'desecrated by the meanness of reality.'

Garrido's accessible philosophical discussion is indispensable for understanding much of the Western left's inability to think dialectically, to truly follow Hegel and Marx rather than just invoke them, to understand the struggle for socialism as it is, rather than as it might be in the politically juvenile imaginations of so many.

Garrido's punchy discourse deals both with the reality of building socialism in China and with the difficulties of building socialism in the US. His demands that black liberation movements connect up with the US's revolutionary traditions will inevitably arouse debate, but it is likely one that must be had."
